# CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

COVID-19 has become an unprecedented challenge to us. The implications are profound and have changed the way we serve our 6,000 socially isolated seniors.

LB will continue to keep our seniors safe and holistically engaged regularly and ensure our healthcare staff have adequate essential Personal Protective Equipment supplies when serving vulnerable seniors.

During this period, our seniors on separate occasions were visited by ministers and top officers of government agencies. We thank them for their care and support.

LB's belief and spirit of serving the socially isolated seniors has never been stronger. COVID-19 has further strengthened the Board, staff and volunteers in the values and beliefs of LB as we celebrate 25 years of connecting seniors and enriching lives. The following projects awarded in 2020 are testament to LB's milestone of 25 years of dedicated service:

- At the national level, we were awarded the 3-year pilot project, LB Care Connect @ Queenstown, by the Agency of Integrated Care in March 2020. This programme will help seniors age in place and anchor the future Community Care System. LB will be the key pillar of community care and serve as the resource centre linking seniors to relevant services.
- In March 2020, we were also awarded the SG Cares Community Partnership Grant by Ministry of Culture, Community & Youth to grow and develop meaningful volunteerism with community partners. To build a caring society, volunteers and corporations from the Queenstown community will partner our seniors to customise personalised LB event favours.
- By the fourth quarter of financial year 2020/2021, LB will set up a Volunteer Training Centre at Blk 163, Stirling Road to conduct training and outreach programmes on elderly psychosocial needs and the correlation between psychosocial well-being and overall functional health.
- Understanding the importance of managing donors, LB will be implementing a Donor Management System to effectively solicit, manage and retain donors.
- LB continues to pilot innovative technology such as using Virtual Reality headsets to increase motor training and reduce the risk of falls by improving our seniors' static and dynamic balance.

To allow for in-depth specialisation and improve service quality, we will identify and close gaps in LB's spectrum of integrated eldercare services through co-creation or collaboration, restructuring Community Outreach Services.

With your continued support, we will have better ability to be a market leader and forerunner of the Befriending sector.

Stay vigilant, stay healthy and stay safe.

狮协服务社会上孤立年长者的这份信 念和精神从未如此强大。随着我们迈 入联系和丰富年长者生活第25年的 同时,经历2019冠状病毒也加强了 我们董事会,职员和志愿者对服务的 信念和价值观。 2020年授予的以下项目都是狮协 25年里奉献服务的里程碑:

- 在国家一级,我们于2020年3月被护联中心授予了三年长的试验项目LB Care Connect @ Queenstown。这项计划将帮助年长者在社区原地养老, 过着丰富的晚年生活,并锚定未来的社区护理系统。狮协将成为社区关怀 的关键支柱,并充当为链接年长者与相关服务的资源中心。
- 2020年3月时,我们也获得了文化,社区与青年部所颁发的SG Cares Community Partnership补助金,为与社区伙伴一同培育和发展有意义的志 愿服务。为建立一个有爱心的社会,女皇镇社区的志愿者和企业公司将与 我们的年长者一同制作个人化的狮协活动记念品。
- 于2020/2021财政年度的第四季,狮协将在史德林路大牌163建立志愿者培训中心,以开展有关年长者心理需求,探讨心理健康与整体健康功能之间 相关性的培训和外展计划。
- 因了解捐赠者管理的重要性,狮协将实施捐赠管理系统,以有效地吸引, 管理和保留捐赠者。
- 狮协继续采用创新科技,例如使用虚拟现实头盔来增加年长者的运动技能, 通过改善他们的静态和动态平衡而减少跌倒的几率。

我们将辨认并缩小狮协综合年长者护理服务范围中的差距,重整社区服务计划,来允许深入的专业化和改善服务质量。

有了您的持续支持,我们将有更大的能力建立志愿服务管理成为友伴领域的 市场领导者和先行者。

Since August 2019, the staff from Ministry of Manpower (MOM) made weekly visits to Clementi SAC @ 366 to interact with the seniors over food and various activities. On 15 January, MOM directors, Ms. Ng Hwei Min and Ms. Sharon Chang, specially dropped by to greet the seniors and distribute red packets and goodie bags.









Music entertainment, games and lo hei were part of an early Chinese New Year celebration for some 40 LB seniors on 19 January, where they spent a fun-filled morning with artistes at MediaCorp.



At Mei Ling SAC, our seniors were thrilled at the presence of the God of Fortune, which was organised as part of the centre's Chinese New Year party, alongside activities such as colouring contest, karaoke, buffet lunch, games and a lion dance performance on 22 January.

Then, bearing the inspiration of wanting to document the social bonds they have forged, the artists hand-drew portraits of the seniors for the art exhibition.

# The art exhibition was held at the Library @ Orchard from 1 to 17 February 2020.








#### LB Awarded SG Cares Community Grant

# COVID-19 - KEEPING OUR COMMUNITY SAFE

In light of COVID-19 and the nationwide circuit breaker measures that were implemented on 7 April 2020, LB has taken necessary adjustments to our services to safeguard the well-being of our clients and staff.

We have switched to weekly telephonic support for seniors under the Befriending Services, Cluster Support and Senior Activity Centres and check on their well-being to ensure that their needs are met.



Our essential services such as Home Personal Care and Senior Group Homes continued to provide care for frail and homebound seniors.



As part of the support from the HR and Staff Welfare team, all staff was given surgical masks, sanitisers and digital thermometer to protect the safety and health of employees. The staff from the Corporate Office gathered to help pack the surgical masks for distribution.



Our SAC staff were equipped on the usage of the safe-entry system for contract tracing at an online training session conducted by our IT colleagues.
